Summary:

Mount Clemens Seminole Academy is seeking a dynamic, energetic STEM/STEAMM Teacher who will prepare the curriculum and provide instruction in music classes for students in our school. Responsible for instructing students in an elementary school from grades DK-5 in a music curriculum. Creates lesson plans, administers high-quality, engaging instruction for all students, supports the implementation of common core standards, and leads a comprehensive STEM/STEAMM instructional program. Leads students in regular classroom settings and for school programs, community activities, etc.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities – Other duties may be assigned:

- Create instructional resources for use in the classroom.
- Use written and verbal communication skills to build community partnerships or write grants to keep the program alive.
- Establishes lessons using the interdisciplinary approach; Science, Math, Engineering, Art, and Music tied into each project the students work on.
- Plan, prepare, and deliver engaging lessons, assignments, and instructional materials
- Establishes learning objectives consistent with assessing student needs, curriculum framework, and human growth and development knowledge.
- Prepares, administers, and corrects evaluations and assessments and records results.
- Create a positive educational climate conducive to children's intellectual, physical, social, and emotional development.
- Participate in ongoing training sessions, Create lesson plans, and modify instructional plans and materials to meet the needs of all students.
- Keeps attendance and grade records as required by Board Policy/Administrative Regulation and performs other administrative duties as needed.
- Read and stay abreast of current topics in education.
- Integrate competencies, goals, objectives, and assessments into lesson plans and classroom implementation.
- Manage student behavior in the classroom conducive to effective learning and supervise students in various school-related settings.
